School Sports Premium

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. The Government are spending over £450 million on this funding over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016.

This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools. OFSTED will play a significant role in ensuring that schools target this funding in areas which will lead to clear outcomes in raising standards and opportunities in PE and school sport for all children throughout the Primary phase. All schools will receive funding for the three identified academic years.

Purpose of Funding

Schools will have to spend the funding on improving their provision of PE and school sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Summary

We have established a very successful and positive partnership with our local primary and secondary schools as part of our local cluster. We have worked as a cluster to employ a local secondary teacher to promote a range of provision in the locality including:

- Staff training at INSET
- Pupil Training in 'Young Leaders'
- Intra cluster competitions

The latter part of the package provides many varied opportunities for children to partake in competitive sports. The range includes: gymnastics, cricket, football, netball, tennis, hockey, running, athletics and multi skills. This last academic year has seen the introduction of tennis and tri-golf to widen the range of opportunity.

In addition to this school staff have had access to additional training from qualified sports coaches. On a weekly basis staff accessed this through the provision of two external sports coaches, delivering and modelling good practise across a range of competitive sports.

We have offered additional out of school sports clubs, through the use of the sports coaches, to both Key Stages one and two. This has resulted in an extension

of the number of school children to join other local sports teams.

School renewed our approach to swimming and promoted a rigorous swim programme taking the Year 3 and 4 children to Ulverston Pool where all children achieved their 25m by the end of year 4. Some children also achieved their Water Safety rescue skills award and the National Curriculum Award.

Performance physical education was further developed through the employment of a local dance school leader, coaching Years 4 and 5 resulting in a live performance to a large audience at a County event.

Children were given an opportunity to take part in County finals cross country resulting in one child being selected to represent Cumbria in the National Finals in March 2016.

In gymnastics, 3 teams entered the cluster Key Steps competition with the Year 3/4 team representing the school at the Cumbria Schools Games Finals in Penrith in March 2016. Our teams were also successful in winning the Year 3 and 4 football tournament, the Year 5 and 6 hockey tournament and will go through to the Level 2 competition in Kendal. The Year 3 and 4 hockey team also came a brilliant second.
