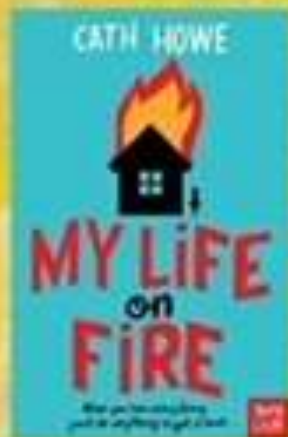


One To Wait for...

Nosy Crow 9+

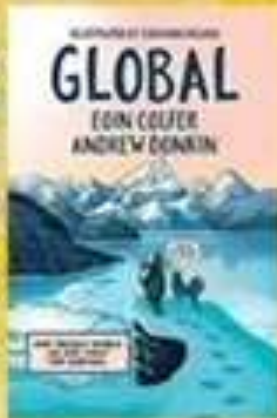

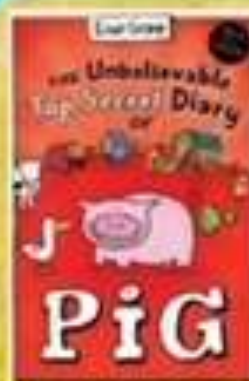
Silver Linings
